



LIKE-TYPE GROUPS

Like-Type Group (LTG): Classification of homes, used to accurately compare utility use, based on:

- Neighborhood
- Number of Bedrooms
- Square Footage (range)
- Construction Year/Type
- Unit/Dwelling Type
- Major System Energy Source



Comparing Apples to Apples

We have two children in our family and live in a 3-BR home. Many of our neighbors do not have children. Will the monthly usage average for our like-type group be skewed?

Families are placed in homes appropriate for the size of the family. Only similar homes, not family size, will be included in average calculations, however the 10% buffer resulting in a Normal Usage Band for each LTG accounts for variances in the homes and family demographics.

Your Like-Type Group Number can be found on your billing statements, by looking up your address in the LTG Detailed Binder or contacting your Naval Housing Representative. The Like-Type Group Summary chart will show characteristics of your home that affect energy performance, taking into account seasonal variations. Each month, the average usage of utilities for the LTG are developed with a 10% buffer above and below the average to create a Normal Usage Band. Residents with usage above the Normal Usage Band will pay for the excess and those conserving relative to the Normal Usage Band will receive a rebate for their savings.
