

Eligible veterans must have a VHIC that states serviceconnected disability, a Purple Heart recipient or former prisoner of war. ## SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION AND RESPONSE PROGRAM

Naval Station Everett 24/7 SAPR Response Line: 425-754-5977

#### RESTRICTED REPORTING

A reporting option that allows sexual assault victims to confidentially disclose the assault to specified individuals without triggering an official investigation. The individuals include SARC, SAPR VA, Deployed Resiliency Counselor, and healthcare provider. Victims can confidentially communicate with the Chaplain and Victims' Legal Counsel (VLC). Victims also have access to medical treatment, advocacy and counseling.

#### UNRESTRICTED REPORTING

A reporting option where the victim's disclosure is reported to law enforcement and may result in an official investigative process. Victims can confidentially communicate with the Chaplain and Victims' Legal Counsel (VLC). Victims also have access to medical treatment, advocacy, counseling, Victim/Witness Assistance Program (VWAP), protective orders and expedited transfer.



## PREVENT SHALLOW WATER BLACKOUT

The practice of hyperventilating and extended breath-holding is prohibited at Navy MWR Aquatics facilities.

#### **Shallow Water Blackout: How it Happens**

1 Hyperventilation
Overbreathing, either
consciously or as a result of
overexertion, artificially lowers
carbon dioxide (CO2) levels.

**2** 0<sub>2</sub> **Drops**As the breath-hold begins, oxygen is metabolized and CO2 levels increase. As the breath-hold continues, the body becomes starved of oxygen.

Unconsiousness

Under normal circumstances, increased CO2 would trigger a breath. But because CO2 levels were so low on submersion (due to hyperventilation), there is not enough to initiate a breath, and the swimmer loses consciousness.

Drowning

4 Once the swimmer loses consciousness, the body reacts and forces a breath. That causes the lungs to fill with water, and without an immediate rescue, a drowning death is all but certain.

- · Never hyperventilate before swimming or diving.
- Swim with a buddy who is closely supervising you and not working out at the same time. If it isn't during an official training evolution, don't rely on a lifeguard to spot your shallow water blackout.
- Give your body enough time to recover, and catch your breath between sets. This will allow oxygen levels to return to normal.

What is it like to be a CDH provider? Hear firsthand from Samantha Castilleja, a Naval Base Kitsap CDH provider for more than 21 years.

#### WHAT MOTIVATED YOU TO BECOME A CHILD DEVELOPMENT HOME PROVIDER?

Samantha mentions the wife of her husband's chief at the time lived on NBK-Bangor and was a Child Homes Daycare provider. She noticed how well the setup was when she went to her house. It perked her interest to get started.

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#### HOW DO YOU BALANCE YOUR PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL LIFE AS A CDH PROVIDER?

"We're open ten hours a day, and after closing time, it's closing time," Samantha says. "I love the flexibility of being at home, being with my children, or being home when my husband gets home." Samantha also reflects on balancing her personal and professional life as a CDH provider. "I enjoy it; I love it. I love to help families. I love the kids and the connections I make with them and their families. It's nice that

the Navy has a program for younger enlisted Sailors to afford available quality childcare, and I think that is important. CDH is a home-like environment where we offer quality, loving care. Many times, these families become our extended families! Just like any job, you find the balance between work and home life. We have flexible schedules as well," Samantha says.

Samantha states a major benefit is the flexibility of taking the business with you when you PCS. She started at NBK-Bangor, moved to Naval Base San Diego, returned to Bangor and reopened. Command, School & Community Communications: School Liaisons serve as subject-matter experts for installation commanders on K-12 issues, helping to connect command, school and community resources.

Homeschool Linkage and Support: School Liaisons assist military families by gathering and sharing information on homeschooling issues, policies and legislation from local school districts, and help leverage military Child and Youth Program resources to support these families.

• Post-Secondary Preparations: School Liaisons leverage installation and school resources to provide graduating military students with access to post-secondary information and opportunities.

Military families are the backbone of our nation's defense. They provide unwavering support to our service members, who in turn, protect our country with valor and honor. However, navigating the complexities of Navy life can be overwhelming for many loved ones. Trying to wade through the waters of caretaking, networking, deployment and homecoming preparations – and even just knowing where to find basic information on Navy life – can be a daunting task for many loved ones. Enter Family Readiness Groups (FRG), integral components of the Navy lifestyle, helping to shape a support community for a common experience.

An FRG is the support network families can turn to for resources rather than tackling challenges alone. They can help welcome and mentor young people who are new to Navy life. They can provide valuable information on what to expect from a service member's next deployment, or assist with a personal crisis that may occur while a service member is underway.

"The FRG's main goal is to provide support for every family in our command," Rachel Burkholder says.

Rachel is an FRG president for a patrol squadron at Naval Air Station Whidbey Island. "Being a part of the FRG gives our families a place to meet new friends and feel like they have someone to ask questions to about the new area they find themselves in, or things that come up being a military family,"

Belonging to a robust FRG helps ensure a pathway to positive outcomes for family members and service members. Lasting friendships are woven, bolstered by the shared experiences and understanding that bind Navy families together. The satisfaction derived from aiding others and the sense of pride in contributing to a greater cause uplift both members and the broader community.

"FRGs create a sense of camaraderie within the military community," Tara Dotson says, Naval Station Everett fitness specialist and former Sailor and current Navy spouse. Her background and experience provide a unique perspective on the crucial role of the FRGs in supporting military families. "During deployments, they may organize monthly or quarterly get-togethers to provide support and a sense of belonging."

The anxiety for service members and family members during deployments can be alleviated through the sense of unity cultivated within the FRG, which can act as a buffer against the strains of separation.

"Having a place to connect and make friends with other people who understand what you are going through is essential to good mental health," Rachel says.

The value of an effective FRG shines even brighter when they can provide military families – especially those experiencing their first deployment – knowledge about available resources, the companionship of newfound friends, and engaging activities, ensuring families of deployed service members are better equipped to navigate the challenges that come their way.





If a command needs to establish an FRG, the Fleet and Family Support Center (FFSC) from Fleet and Family Readiness can help provide the necessary guidance for creating one. FRGs require their own bylaws and FRG leadership must be properly trained to liaise with commands and steer the group toward success. FFSC is also able to support established FRGs with refresher training and resources.

"Fleet and Family Support Center can provide you with a two-day course that will give you the knowledge and tools necessary to start up and operate an effective FRG that can support families before, during and after deployment," Naval Base Kitsap FFSC Work and Family Life Supervisor, Terry Wimmer says. She also notes FFSC FRG coordinators can assist the FRGs in attracting and motivating members, financial planning, fundraising policies, event planning, homecoming and other social gatherings, and operation preparedness and emergency response.

A strong support system for military families cannot be understated, which is why FRGs play such a vital role in our military communities. They also serve as an integral extension from commands to service members' families. FRGs contribute to a resilient overall well-being, from disseminating important information to boosting morale by keeping service members' families well cared for during deployments.

"Whether it's offering emotional support, providing practical assistance, or creating a network of understanding, our FRG is there to support our community," Rachel says.

# **EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER SUPPORT**

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) ensures service members will be assigned to a location where the special needs of the family will be met. EFMP is a mandatory program for spouses, children, and dependent family members, who require special medical, psychological, or educational services.

The Exceptional Family Member will then be assigned a category according to diagnosis, availability of care and intensity of care. Category 1 is the least complex, while 5 is the most complex, Category 6 is for temporary placement in the EFM program, for example, high-risk pregnancy or a premature infant.

The category assigned to a family member will impact what duty stations a family can accompany their service member, however, enrollment in EFMP does not affect one's career, as promotion boards are unaware of EFM status.



- 5. Military Discounts apply to you. Most companies that give military discounts also give discounts to DoD employees. You are eligible for services that cater to military personnel, such as American Forces Travel, GovX and shop. id.me. Several hotels will also allow you to get the military rate, even if not traveling on military orders. On base you can shop tax free and fill up your gas tank for less at the Navy Exchange (NEX). Always be prepared to show your ID.
- 6. Career planning and training available; never feel stuck. FFR offers on-going training and professional development. Once a part of the federal work force, you can also take classes at a Fleet & Family Support Center to improve your skills or rebuild your resume.
- 7. TSA PreCheck® for free. Federal civilian employees are able to opt-in to TSA PreCheck®. Save your DoD ID number as your known traveler number when booking a ticket and travel through the airport with ease.





- 8. Keep your kids having fun. As a federal civilian employee, your base access allows your kids to play! Some bases have bowling, fishing ponds, playgrounds, STEM kits, crafts, libraries, the Child & Youth Programs have Youth & Teen Centers available, and movie theaters have family films. Most on-base activities for the family applies to you too!
- 9. Getaways all over world. DoD lodging offers hotels, cabins, cottages and more, anywhere a U.S. military base is located. A cottage in Pacific Beach or hotel in Italy, the reasonable rates make traveling a breeze. Check availability at https://www.dodlodging.net
- 10. 10 paid holidays! Depending on your job, you'll either get paid to enjoy the day off or earn extra holiday pay if you are scheduled to work on one of the 10 federally recognized holidays. Regular full-time and regular parttime workers also start earning sick leave and vacation leave each pay cycle. Regular full-time employees start to earn 13 vacation days per year. The longer you stay in federal service, the more vacation days you earn.






